A look back at our year!

We have had an AMAZING year in 2018! It would be impossible to give you details of every story, of every project, and every lesson we have given and everything we have achieved, but we do have some amazing statistics to share with you!

In 2018, with our Storytelling, Easter, It's Your Move, Anti-bullying and Christmas projects, we delivered **237 primary school projects**, and we also delivered **129 primary school R.E lessons!**

In Secondary schools in 2018 we really upped our number of R.E lessons. We have had a huge increase, and delivered **50 lessons** across the year!


To give you some perspective on our work, I would like to

share with you the break down of where our time goes from our 2018 analysis.

In Primary schools, **48% of our work in the last year was Projects**, the largest

proportion of our workload. We are really pleased to report that our second largest proportion is **now R.E lessons at 26%** of our workload. This is amazing, as we have really pushed ourselves in R.E this year. 15% is Primary assemblies, and in a new high, 8% is Guardians clubs which have been a new initiative of 2018. 3% are R.E days!

Contrastingly, our work in Secondary schools is quite different. The largest proportion of our work is **still clubs at 42%**, which demonstrates the difference between how we




must work in primary and how we work in secondary. After that, again, we are really pleased to see **that R.E is our next biggest proportion at 23%**. This is a considerable jump from last year and reflects the overall ethos of our team to provide outstanding R.E lessons and projects to schools.

Following that, mentoring is still a large part of our secondary work at 15%, and assemblies at 13%. Special projects, such as PSHE lessons, make up the final 7%.

When I look back at the amount of work, and the diversity of it that we have achieved, I am very proud and thankful for what God has enabled us to do.

Behind each statistic is a child who has learnt more about Christians and Jesus!
